





Extra Curricular

Extra curricular activities will offer pupils opportunities to perform outside of a classroom setting. Pupils will gain and develop skills in specific instruments, as well as working with other groups of students to develop social skills. Extra-curricular activities will offer additional challenges to stimulate their learning to further develop themselves as musicians. Confidence building will also be a main focus to encourage students to perform publicly in school performances, such as musicals, lunch time concerts and instrumental practice. Students will also be encouraged to perform at offsite events, enabling them to connect with other musicians a like. These additional opportunities will allow pupils to express their creativity in a fun and interactive environment.



Musical Enrichment

The main goal throughout KS3 is to enrich students' knowledge of music. Pupils will learn many transferable skills which they can carry forward into whichever direction they choose to take. Throughout KS3, students will learn how to specialise in a variety of instruments by studying a vast number of musical cultures, taking part in practical activities such as class ensemble performances and working independently to perform and compose music. These lessons will enhance musical development and ability. Communication and teamwork with peers is a significant part of music practice, meaning students will have the opportunity to lead groups independently, as well as working together in a band setting. Supporting their peers is also a main focus when pupils are performing solo, or as part of an ensemble in class. They will also study musical devices which are prominent in specific cultures in order to broaden musical influence. Historical knowledge such as the slave trade, will also make connections of how music has developed over time through cultural influences. Overall, students will leave KS3 with an extensive amount of knowledge and experience to become a well-rounded, confident musician.






