Duke of Edinburgh's Award Practice Expedition – Saturday 10th May 2025
Duke of Edinburgh's Award Qualifying Expedition – 21st – 22nd June 2025

As you are already aware, a key part of the Duke of Edinburgh's award is the Expedition section. This year, we will be running a Practice Expedition in the morning of Saturday 10th May (10:00am – approximately 13:00pm). Attendance at this is strongly encouraged, as it will give the students a sense of what they will be completing during the Qualifying Expedition.

The Qualifying Expedition will then take place on 21st and 22nd June, and students must attend this in order to complete their Award. Failure to attend will result in them either not gaining the full Award, or them having to complete it with next year's cohort of students. Students will depart from Cansfield High School on the Saturday morning, camping at Bispham Hall Scout Estate, Billinge, and they will return to school on the Sunday afternoon. Exact timings will be given closer to the time, as the groups will have staggered departure times.

Please see below a QR code for you to scan and complete to give consent for your child to take part in the Practice and Qualifying Expeditions. Also attached is a Code of Conduct and a Mobile Phone Policy. Can all of the attached documents be filled out **before Friday 2nd May 2025**. **Any paper documents should be given to Mr Briggs (Room 25) or Mr Critchley (Room 26)**. There is no extra cost for these trips.

An equipment list has already been given out to students at the training sessions, and this was also given out at the last Parent Meeting, however I have also attached a copy to this letter also. The majority of the equipment on this list, they will already have and it is mainly there for packing purposes. The major purchases you will need to make are a tent, rucksack, sleeping bag, sleeping mat, walking boots and walking pants. We do have a healthy supply of tents, rucksacks, sleeping bags and sleeping mats in school. Please get in touch as soon as possible if you wish for your child to borrow any of these items as they will, mostly, be given out on a first-come, first-served basis.

Code of Conduct

When on any visit, you will be seen as an ambassador for your school. Your behaviour will reflect on what other people think of you, your friends and the school and, as such, you are required to follow and agree to this guidance. If you do not behave as expected, you may be returned home at your parents' expense.

Remember

- You are away from home, in new surroundings. Lots of things will be different from what you are used to
- Behave on out-of-school activities as you are expected to behave in school
- Listen carefully to instructions and do as you are told
- If you are worried about something, tell a member of staff before you contact home
- If you or any of the group is in danger, tell a teacher immediately
- Always follow the school rules: be polite, be sensible, be helpful, be pleasant
- All alcohol, tobacco, lighters/matches, non-prescription drugs/medicines are forbidden

At the venue

- Respect all property, both indoors and outdoors
- Stay within the permitted boundaries of the site
- Share facilities sensibly and fairly
- Dispose of rubbish carefully and properly
- If there is any damage, no matter how it was caused, tell a member of staff straight away

Personal Organisation

- Listen carefully to instructions, and follow them – first time
- If you are not sure of something, work together as a group to get organised and back on track
- Look after each other, so that nothing and nobody gets lost
- Look after your own belongings and those of others
- Make sure you bring your mobile phone into school on the Saturday to be collected by staff
- If you are on medication, ask your teacher for your medicine at the right times

At the campsite

- At bedtime, when asked, stay in your tent unless you need help
- Do not go into other students tents
- Make sure your clothes and other belongings are stored in a tidy manner

Meals

- Ensure you have enough food for yourself for both days of the Expedition
- When using the cooking stoves, behave in a sensible way, as per your training, and follow all instructions given by staff to prevent injuries
- Ideally, cook in groups of 2-3 to speed up cooking and get everybody fed sooner

Whilst walking

- Make sure you stay as a team – do not split up unless it is an emergency as per your training
- Respect the environment: always follow the countryside code
- Respect the roads: always follow the highway code

If you get lost

- Don't panic; stay calm
- Stop where you are, and work as a team to locate yourselves on the map, and locate where you should be
- Work out a plan to get back onto your planned route
- If you have been trying to get back on route, but you are still lost, and it is over 1 hour since your last scheduled checkpoint, take out the group phone, call the safeguarding number and inform staff of your situation

DofE Expedition Mobile Phone Policy

One of the 20 Conditions of the Expedition is that there is a Mobile Phone Policy in place. For the weekend of the Expedition, mobile phones will **NOT** be allowed to be used.

- Students are required to bring their phones with them into school on the morning of the Expedition. This is so that they will be able to contact home upon returning to school.
- Mobile phones will then be collected in before they depart and kept safe for the weekend.
- Mobile phones will not be allowed to be used whilst the students are walking, or at the campsite.
- **ONE** person per group will keep their mobile phone in their rucksack. This will be in a sealed plastic bag and switched off. This person will be selected on the morning of departure. This is so that if there is an emergency whilst the students are out, they can call the school safeguarding number, and we can help them deal with their emergency, or locate and find them.
- The student keeping their phone will add the safeguarding number to their contacts before departing, and they will also need to have the app 'What3Words' downloaded to their mobile phones. This is an app that splits the whole country into squares of 10m² in size that can be used to locate them to a high level of accuracy.
- Groups will also be equipped with a tracker that will ping their live locations to staff who will be continually monitoring the position of each group. This is a secure way of locating groups that only staff that have the link can access this service.

I have read, and understand, the above mobile phone policy.

I understand that if I do not comply with the above policy, I am at risk of failing the Expedition section of the DofE Award and put my group at risk of failing.
